We have had exciting January rough weather to deal with this year!

Our docks were imperiled again, even with most of them removed. But thanks to Port Captain Ski Tarnoski, S/C Greg Ronkainan, Tom Marland and Jeff Chambers who figured out how to mitigate the risk in the middle of the storm, only some minor damage occurred.

We were fortunate that the recent King Tide, right on the heels of our previous storm, didn't inflict more damage on the docks. Both high and low tide levels are exaggerated during a King Tide, and our west dock actually finds itself on the bottom. This creates damage to the floats and difficulty for the Youth Foundation sailors to launch their boats.

As some of you are aware, dredging of the harbor is scheduled to begin on or about February 1st and it will take about six weeks to complete. This will mitigate some of the risk to the docks during future storms, and will help

the Youth Foundation sailors to spend more time on the water and less time trying to get their boats into it. The dredging will remove about 60,000 cubic yards of bottom material from the harbor and relocate it to the beach along the Avenues. This will be a big help, as our end of the harbor has been filling up with sand and rocks from the storms which push sand through the breakwater. The dredging equipment will begin to arrive in the last week of January.

How about the new paint job, the new glass door and our beautiful gardens? Our club is looking better than it has for years. Special thanks to House and Art Chair Rosie Vullo and John LoBue, for doing such a great job rooting out the problems and selecting and managing the contractors to get our club looking beautiful. And special thanks to S/C Francie Hope and S/C Burr Hope for making our gardens more beautiful than I ever remember them being, and for rescuing them from the saltwater assault that we seem to be dealing with from time to time.

This is indeed a special place to be, and I look forward to seeing you around the club soon!

book sets out to examine possibilities of
the future of Homo Sapiens. The premise
outlines that during the 21st century,
humanity is likely to make a significant
attempt to gain happiness, immortality, and
God-like powers.

Throughout the book, Harari openly speculates various ways that this ambition might be real and in the first 78 pages of this book's introduction Harari wrote so much information in a small

expanse of a few paragraphs that the book seemed overbearing! So at first, the general consensus was that we should have read *Sapiens* first because it was written before *Homo Deus* and because maybe that information would have made this book's introduction easier to read. But on second thought, I think he did that on purpose to create tension and emphasise the calamitous condition of the world he was describing in this book.

Then, when part one begins with: Homo Sapiens Conquers the World the tone of the writing style relaxes and the book becomes easier to read and you realize that it does not matter whether you read Sapiens before or after Homo Deus, as the author does repeat the pertinent information in the second book, as he develops the subject related to the first book... Like a movie flash back!

While researching about "Sapiens" I ran into the following remarks: "It is an iron rule of history that what looks inevitable in hindsight was far from obvious at the time.' Harari's hindsight in Sapiens is a wide 70,000-year canvas, a grand-scheme history of homo sapiens and a work of March sometimes jaw-dropping surprises. How exciting that Harari has reinterpreted this unconventional, provoking and thoughtful book into graphic narrative form. The illustrations and the distillation of the arching story to a cinematic telling will capture new readers and captivate those already familiar". Barnes and Noble.
